## Steel City Mennonite Church Mid-Week Connection April 1, 2015

With summertime come weddings and being Bev and I are fully engaged in "wedding mode"! There are a couple of wedding etiquette details that I have found over the years which are beneficial to all attendees of a wedding.

## Some do's and don'ts to remember:

**Do** honor the sanctity of marriage by being attentive and quietly reverent; no loud whistles or comments.

**Don't** show up as a "surprise" guest (whether as a date, with children or as an extra) to the ceremony or reception. Seating can be limited in sanctuaries and receptions. Unless a blanket invitation is printed in a worship folder or spoken publicly indicating that whoever would like to attend the ceremony is welcome, the wedding ceremony and/or reception is by invitation only.

**Do** show up if you have indicated via RSVP that you will attend. A headcount is usually required for receptions and the bride/groom and/or family will be charged accordingly. Obviously, emergencies do happen and when they do, communicate them to the bride and groom in a timely manner.

**Do** silence your cell phone and other electronic devices.

Don't use your flash when taking photographs. Camera flashes cause the video recordings to momentarily go black.

**Do** arrive at least 15 minutes early. This will give you opportunity to attend to any bathroom needs prior to the ceremony and not during the ceremony.

**Don't** monopolize the bride and groom either in the receiving line or reception. The traditional greeting to the bride is "Best Wishes" and to the groom, "Congratulations".

**Do** remember this is their SPECIAL DAY! It is all about the bride and groom on this day.
