Revival Meetings:

In a little more than a week, we will kick-off our series of Revival Meetings with Phil Stutzman. Previously you have been encouraged to attend, reminded of the dates and invited to pray for these special meetings. The Worship Commission has been practicing music for our gatherings. The Evangelism Commission has captured our attention with powerful announcements and pointed personal stories of the "Why and Who" of revival. So what is left to do in preparation? Here are a few items to address:

Clear out your calendar for those evenings. There are very few things on our calendars that can't be rescheduled or canceled. A 7:00 p.m. start time on Monday through Wednesday evenings allows for after school sporting practices AND attending revival meetings. This is an opportunity to put God in the highest priority and for your children to see your example.

Engage the enemy! As we get closer to the Revival Meetings, the more distractions of illness, accidents, discord and strife we will encounter as a body. That is the enemy of God trying to get you to surrender to him without you even knowing it. Stand your ground! Take authority over the prince of darkness by reminding him of the One who said, "I am the light of the world."

Pray with purpose. Each Wednesday evening, a small number of people have prayed diligently for our gatherings. But as we get into the final stretch, we are going to do something different, blending technology and prayer. So, rather than meeting together for prayer on Wednesday evenings, (April 8 and 15), you are encouraged to set a 7:00 p.m. alarm that will remind you to pray for specific items related to the Revival Meetings. In addition, to help us daily "Pray with purpose", you will be receiving, via email or by text message (see below), a daily prayer focus item. Incorporate this into your devotions or your family prayer time. How wonderful it is to have your children pray for this event as well.

Wednesday's Prayer Focus: The Holy Spirit's anointing upon Phil Stutzman as he prayerfully prepares for our Revival meetings.

Thursday's Prayer Focus: Pray for your availability to encounter God on April 19-22. Has God set an appointment with you?

Friday's Prayer Focus: Pray for those who will be attending. Ask God to meet them where they are.
