Dear Congregation,

The summer of 2015 is almost history. For many, summer has provided a relaxing change of pace. Vacations and staycations have dotted our calendars. Backyard BBQ's and picnics have punctuated the long days of June, July and August.

But here comes September 2015! Days are shorter and seem more hectic. Children are back in school. Homework ensues. Athletic practices demand time. Extra curricular clubs meet regularly again. Work projects resume greater intensity. Career advancement classes begin. Vacations are a fading memory. And our favorite TV programs start a new broadcast season.

Stephen Covey, in the classic "Seven Habits of the Highly Effective People", writes about the parable of the big rocks. His emphasis is to intentionally place your most important events on your calendar first and then fill in the remaining time with lesser significant things. There are two parts to this that stand out. One, you must decide what is most important to you. Second, you must be intentional about making what is important a top priority.

Unapologetically, I believe that one's spiritual life and the spiritual nurture of one's family is the "biggest rock" of a person's significance. I believe we are living in a time of rampant evil and great moral decline. The follower of Jesus Christ must be equipped to counteract the power of darkness. Such equipping doesn't happen on its own; it must be intentional.

To that end, I issue the challenge to you to take full advantage of the opportunities for spiritual growth offered at SCMC.

- Sunday Morning Worship Encounter (9:30) Yes, I know it is early. Yes, I know it is the only morning you can sleep in. Yes, I know it is a long time to sit. Yes, I know it can be boring. But beginning your week surrounded by the community of faith learning from the Word of God together can be so energizing for the rest of your week.
- Sunday School "If we leave right after worship, we can get to the Diner before the Lutheran's or Bible Fellowshippers get out". If that is your reasoning for not being apart of Sunday School, tell me because I know "people" at the Diner. This fall, starting September 13, most all the classes, including one for 18-25 year olds, will be learning about money management with the Dave Ramsey material. There will be an adult class in the Chapel which will focus on "Kingdom Come". "Kingdom Come" is an Anabaptist curriculum written by the Conservative Mennonite Conference.
- Sunday Evening Service (6:30) Think of this a smorgasbord of opportunities for your spiritual growth. Some evenings, I will open a "Can of Worms". Some evenings will be given to a prayer experience. Some evenings, I will discuss foreign mission field ideas and challenges. There is even a Talent Show on the calendar for September 27. The first "Can of Worms" is titled, "When the Court and Church Clash".
- Wednesday Evening Good News Club, Ignite (Jr. High), Connect (Sr. High) These are age specific groups that
 meet every other Wednesday evening. Good News Club meets from 6:30-7:45 pm. Ignite meets from 6:30-8:00
 pm. Connect meets from 7:00-8:15 pm.Parents, you are encouraged to decide for your children whether or not
 they will participate. Remember, Joshua said, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." Joshua knew
 his "big rock".
- Wednesday Evening Bible Study (7:00) We will be going through the Gospel of Luke to be reintroduced to Jesus. This is a great opportunity to bring friends, coworkers or family members because it will focus on Jesus, not church, not rules, not wrongs, just Jesus!

There are many other opportunities offered throughout any given month. And until you take advantage of them they are just that - opportunities!
