Rachel Godshall's Experience: "The past 2 weeks, Rachel spent quite a bit of time at both Columbia Medical Center in NYC, & the Children's Hospital in Philadelphia. The Dept of Neurology at Columbia invited Rachel to participate in a research study to collect extensive data that will help improve the diagnosis of Mitochondrial disease, as well as to inform future potential treatments. Rachel volunteered to participate and spent an exhausting 18 hours over the course of two days in various exams, MRIs, neuropsychological assessments, muscle tests, blood tests, sweat tests, and more. Upon returning home the study continued with additional exams, & at-home samples, over the course of several days. This was beyond exhausting for Rachel! She knew going into the study that it would be a sacrifice, of "no personal benefit" - as the contract stated, however, she was committed and grateful to be contributing to something that may in the future benefit others suffering from Mito disease! The Columbia study is expected to conclude in roughly two years. This past Tuesday, Rachel spent 7 hours at CHOP in a comprehensive evaluation with their Mitochondrial team. She met with genetic counselors, a nutritionist, a Neuro physician, a leading/well known Mitochondrial physician, a social worker, etc. We learned of the latest genetic testing capabilities (which have improved significantly since Rachel's last biopsy testing 15 years ago in Atlanta) which they will be performing on her samples to understand the extent of her Mito deletions. We learned more about the "Mito cocktail" supplements, specifically those that have been tested on CHOPS infected Mito lab animals & which have proven to be helpful with symptoms. We gained insight into the likely causes of her chronic stomach pain & nausea, and a plan of action for helping to treat her symptoms. She was connected with their pharmacy partner that will convert the supplements (which she is unable to swallow due to her weakening throat muscles) to a liquid formula that she can manage. The social worker was also helpful in understanding some of the future options for Rachel as her independence continues to decline. This was overall a very informative, comprehensive, (and exhausting) 7 hours for Rachel! There are many items for her to follow up on, additional appointments to make with specialists, additional supplements to take, and so on. The very heavy and emotional aspect of these exams is the 'reaffirming' of Rachel's declining condition, both physical and cognitive. That said, we are so grateful to live in a place where we have access to these doctors and specialists who dedicate their life to helping people like Rachel! We ask that you continue to lift up Rachel in prayer as she navigates all of this information, the realities of her disorder, and for strength as she manages her symptoms as they continue to progress.
